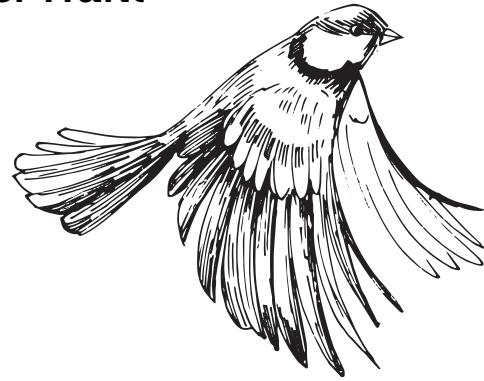


# What Kind of Bird is That?

## Bird I.D. Scavenger Hunt

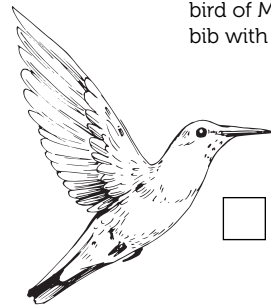
Did you know that there are 292 different species of birds that call Maine home? You can probably see a few outside your window right now! **Learn about some of the common birds found in Maine, below, and check off each one when you see it!**



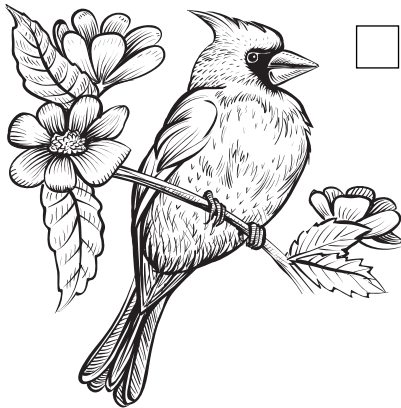
- American Goldfinch**  
*Spinus tristis*  
Males are bright lemon yellow with a black cap, females are brown with a dull yellow bib.



- Black-capped Chickadee**  
*Poecile atricapillus*  
The black-capped chickadee is the state bird of Maine! They have a black cap and bib with white on both sides of the face.

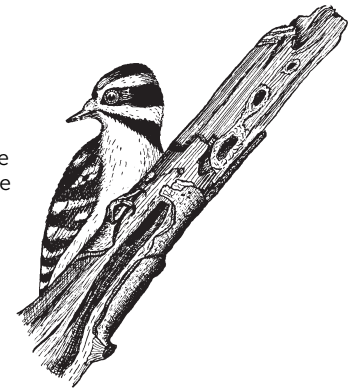


- Ruby-throated Hummingbird**  
*Archilochus colubris*  
Hummingbirds' eggs are teeny tiny — about the size of a jelly bean! Male ruby-throated hummingbirds have a bright red chest and females have a white chest.

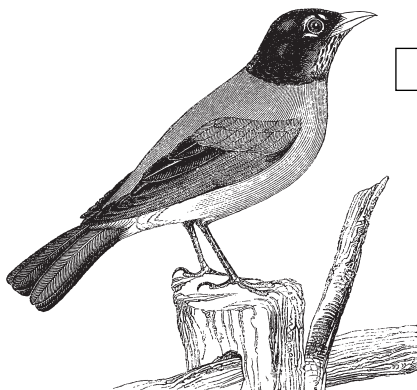


- Northern Cardinal**  
*Cardinalis cardinalis*  
Male cardinals are bright red with black on their faces and females are a soft brown.

- Downy Woodpecker**  
*Dryobates pubescens*  
Downy woodpeckers are the smallest North American woodpecker. Males are black and white with a red patch on the head, and females are black and white.



- American Robin**  
*Turdus migratorius*  
Robins are brown with bright red chests and stomachs. They're often seen hunting for worms on lawns!



- Blue Jay**  
*Cyanocitta cristata*  
Blue jays are bright blue with black stripes and white tips on their wings.
